8:34a	10:01a	7:29p	<p>New Testament Reading Romans 10:5-14 For Moses writes that the law's way of making a person right with God requires obedience to all of its commands. But faith's way of getting right with God says, "Don't say in your heart, 'Who will go up to heaven?' (to bring Christ down to earth). And don't say, 'Who will go down to the place of the dead?' (to bring Christ back to life again)." In fact, it says,</p> <p>"The message is very close at hand; it is on your lips and in your heart."</p> <p>And that message is the very message about faith that we preach: If you openly declare that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.</p> <p>For it is by believing in your heart that you are made right with God, and it is by openly declaring your faith that you are saved.</p> <p>As the Scriptures tell us, "Anyone who trusts in Him will never be disgraced." Jew and Gentile are the same in this respect. They have the same Lord, who gives generously to all who call on him. For "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."</p> <p>But how can they call on Him to save them unless they believe in Him? And how can they believe in Him if they have never heard about Him? And how can they hear about Him unless someone tells them?</p>	
8:36a	10:03a	7:31p	<p>New Testament Reading 2 Corinthians 5:17-21 This means that anyone who belongs to Christ has become a new person. The old life is gone; a new life has begun!</p> <p>And all of this is a gift from God, who brought us back to Himself through Christ. And God has given us this task of reconciling people to Him. For God was in Christ, reconciling the world to Himself, no longer counting people's sins against them. And He gave us this wonderful message of reconciliation.</p> <p>So we are Christ's ambassadors; God is making His appeal through us. We speak for Christ when we plead, "Come back to God!" For God made Christ, who never sinned, to be the offering for our sin, so that we could be made right with God through Christ.</p>

The Word was with God, and the Word was God.</p> <p>He existed in the beginning with God.</p> <p>God created everything through Him, and nothing was created except through Him.</p> <p>The Word gave life to everything that was created, and His life brought light to everyone.</p> <p>The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness can never extinguish it.</p> <p>God sent a man, John the Baptist, to tell about the Light so that everyone might believe because of his testimony. John himself was not the Light; he was simply a witness to tell about the Light. The one who is the true Light, who gives light to everyone, was coming into the world.</p> <p>He came into the very world He created, but the world didn't recognize Him. He came to His own people, and even they rejected Him. But to all who believed Him and accepted Him, He gave the right to become children of God. They are reborn—not with a physical birth resulting from human passion or plan, but a birth that comes from God.</p> <p>So the Word became human and made His home among us. He was full of unending love and faithfulness. And we have seen His glory, the glory of the Father's one and only Son.</p>
