Hear these words of forgiveness, for they are from Christ Himself: As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen. "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"
